What is Grutt Pass 2011?

- Grutt Pass is a value-priced ticket booklet which provides admission or discounts to the [71 facilities](#).
- Grutt Pass allows one-time admission to each facility.
 - *Permanent Exhibition: An exhibition of works and materials from each museum's collection.
 - *Special Exhibition: An exhibition specially held by each museum.

Validity

- Grutt Pass is valid for two months from the date of your first admission. Please note that the final expiration date will be March 31, 2012. Please have the expiration date stamped on your Grutt Pass upon first use.
On sale: April 1, 2011→January 31, 2012

Notice

- Passes are non-refundable.
- Passes are non-transferable.
- Please contact each facility for details of discounts and exhibitions.
- Grutt Pass cannot be used in combination with any other discount tickets.
- Please check the discount rate when children and seniors (65 years & older) visit exhibitions.
- Grutt Pass without a legible expiration date and any tickets detached from the booklet will be void.
